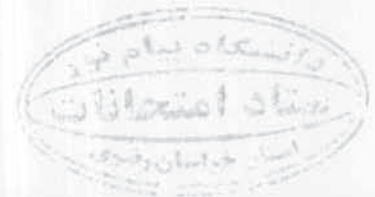

School Patrol to Hunt for Weapons

Special Police Team Part of DC Mayor's Response to Violence

A team of police officers and school security guards will begin unannounced searches of DC school students and their lockers to confiscate weapons, Mayor Sharon Pratt Kelly said yesterday.

The team of 21 officers and guards, to begin operation after two weeks of special training, will first target the most violent of the city's schools, according to school officials and police.

The search team is the second part of Kelly's response to 10 serious incidents of violence at DC schools since the start of the school year. Last Wednesday, the day a student was seriously wounded in a shooting at Eastern High School, Kelly joined school officials and police in announcing that the city would assign 60 police officers to supplement the 38 already patrolling at junior high and high schools.

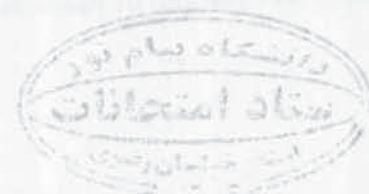

Tough New Limits on Smoking Sought for New York City Council Bill Introduced

Plan Goes Beyond 1988 Law—Virtually All Public Places Would be Under Bans

The leadership of the City Council announced yesterday that it was seeking sweeping new restrictions on smoking in New York City, banning it in virtually all public places, from outdoor arenas and playgrounds to most restaurants and offices, except in enclosed, specially ventilated rooms.

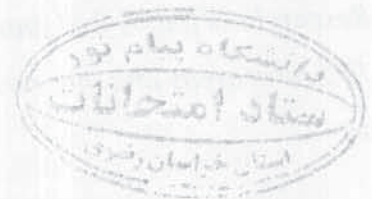
The city already has smoking restrictions, passed in 1988, that require designated nonsmoking areas in restaurants and other public places and that limit smoking in workplace. But the new legislation, introduced by Council speaker Peter F. Vallone of Queens and for that reason very likely to be passed by the Council, would make New York one of the most smoking restricted cities in the nation.

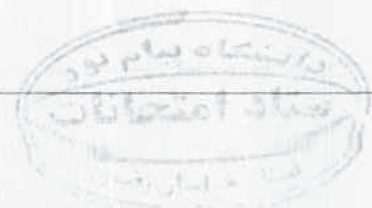

Baby Immunization Lag

Associated Press: Fewer than half the babies in major US cities get all their vaccinations by age 2, and those who are up-to-date on immunizations do not receive them at recommended intervals, a study found.

"Immunization levels of 2-year-olds in our cities are unacceptably low," said Elizabeth R. Zell, statistics chief for immunization at the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Researchers led by Zell analyzed doctor-certified medical records of children entering school in 19 urban areas and one rural area - Van Buren County, Ark - during the 1990 and 1991 school year.
