There are so many styles of criticism that it's impossible to catalogue them all. There are common, everyday zaps ("Congratulations! You've finally done it!") and others so hurtful they leave us dizzy and upset ("How do you manage to keep your bust so small?" or, "Oh, I see you are doing what you do best—eating").

There are comments insensitive beyond belief. When a man had plucked up the courage to tell his mother that his wife had left him, his mother snapped, "What took her so long?"

Families are supposed to be havens from the world. But, in fact, relatives say things they never would outside the family, often with the excuse "You know I wouldn't say this if I didn't love you."

Passage 1

Storytime is certainly an important time for young children. Reading aloud promotes language and literacy development and enriches children's experience by adding to their growing body of knowledge. Sharing books with young children is also a way of helping them learn to cope with childhood fears. According to Burke (1990), "Along with gentle counseling and selective media exposure, books can help to reduce some of the fears that commonly afflict young children". These fears include "fears of darkness, falling, monsters, pain, loss of those they love, abandonment, and a host of other things."

For many children, nighttime brings numerous fears. The combination of darkness and shadows often fosters the creation of imaginary creatures—monsters, ferocious animals and other nightmarish things. This unit began with the reading of *How To Get Rid of Bad Dreams* by Nancy Hazbry and Roy Condy. As a natural extension of this book, students wrote a class book filled with advice to others on how to get rid of bad dreams. Even 1st graders responded well to this activity. Ideas came to them quickly, although many were adaptations from the original book. The children dictated or wrote their own advice and then illustrated their individual pages. The pages were then compiled into a class book to be circulated in the regular classrooms and **checked out** and taken home by students. Teachers, students and parents were encouraged to use blank pages inserted in the back to write comments about the book. When the book was circulated, we were delighted to learn that other children were inspired to write about their dreams during their free time.
